Facility Improvements

Though we've not been able to worship together in person since the onset of the pandemic, nevertheless, the last two months have seen much activity at our church as some long needed improvements have been undertaken and completed. In the sanctuary the water damaged wall has been repaired and the unused chimney casing removed. Remarkable how much space that seems to add. And on the outside, rotten wood and broken glass has been replaced, and all walls and windows given two fresh coats of paint after much needed scraping and power washing. Much of this work was made possible by last year's picnic fundraiser and a generous \$10,000 grant from the Scott Foundation.
